Course Description and Objectives

This is a continuation of Greek I. The course will focus on advanced grammar and vocabulary, as well as other elements necessary for the student to begin reading the New Testament in Greek. The class will complete the lessons in the two textbooks early in the semester and concentrate on reading the Greek New Testament, beginning with the Johannine Literature.

The objective of this course is the complete coverage of the basic and advanced grammar and vocabulary of New Testament Greek. This course will concentrate on detailed morphology (forms) and syntax as students develop their reading and grammar skills.
