

## **Biblical Models of Leadership MF4901**

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Time: Friday and Saturday, October 15-16, and October 29-30, 9:00 a.m.-4:30 p.m.

Credit : 2 credit hours

Prerequisites: None

### Course Description and Objectives:

**Read the Laniak and Clarke texts closely before you attend the first class (you may skim pp. 31-74 in Laniak) and bring all the required texts with you to class, including a NRSV or NIV Bible.** We will attempt to clearly understand what the Bible teaches about leadership. You will quickly see that there are various models of leadership presented in the Bible and we will examine and discuss these extensively. Read Laniak and Clark with the Bible next to you so that you can easily refer to the biblical texts as the authors refer to them. During the first two days of the intensive class each student will choose a biblical text or leader as the focus for a research paper about leadership, which will be presented orally in class on October 29 or 30, and due in final written form Thursday, November 4.

### Required Texts:

A modern translation of the Bible. The NRSV or NIV are preferred. You are welcome to bring additional translations to compare during our class studies.
